

Restricted Scenario G Background Information

A remnant of a tropical storm has caused serious street flooding throughout Blue Water County. While the storm is expected to pass shortly, the flooding has been particularly intense in the city of Bayport. There was a power outage due to a transformer fire in the neighborhood of the Gilmore Nursing Home. The generator did not activate due to mechanical failure and poor maintenance, leaving the nursing home without power. Temperatures are expected to exceed 100 degrees this afternoon as the storm clears. It may be days before the damage can be fixed. The residents can't stay in the facility due to the heat and high humidity. An evacuation needs to occur quickly before the temperatures climb.



Emergency Operations Center (EOC) (male): This is the Liberty County EOC calling for Bayport Chief Carr.

Chief Carr (male): This is Chief Carr.

EOC (male): Chief Carr we are getting a request from the corporate CEO of Gilmore Nursing Corporation a Mr. J. Sinclair, the local power outage has affected them and their generator has failed. They are requesting emergency assistance. Mr. Sinclair indicated that they may need evacuation.

Chief Carr (male): I will contact our EMS chief to assess the situation. We can start planning for an Ambulance Strike Team and EMS Task Force for response with several handicapped-capable buses.

EOC (male): Understood. We'll start notifying the other agencies and place the resources on standby.

Chief Winston (female): Joanne Winston, how can I help you?

Chief Carr (male): Hi Chief Winston. This is Chief Carr. Can you get down to the Gilmore Nursing Home to assess the situation? Flooding and a power failure may require evacuation of that facility.

Chief Winston (female): Absolutely I'll check with the facility.

Chief Carr (male): Hi, Joanne.

Chief Winston (female): Hi Chief. I'm at the facility and the mechanics are here looking at the generator and a power surge when it went down has damaged the facility's power system and there is some water in the building. There is no life threat yet. However, the heat, humidity, and ongoing water damage inside the building will make it uninhabitable for most of the occupants. We'll need to move the patients.

Chief Carr (male): Joanne, I've got the EOC on the other line. Hold on a sec, and I'll conference everyone in. (Two second pause.) Everyone here?

Chief Winston (female) + EOC (male): Yes, sir.

EOC (male): Chief Carr, the power company is saying two days to replace the generator and, due to the storm, portable power systems are in short supply. We suggest that you move the occupants to other facilities.

Chief Carr (male): OK. Joanne. You're the IC, start putting a plan together. The EOC already has resources requested. Let's get this thing rolling.

Chief Winston (female): Yes, sir ... (Fades out.)
