SCENARIO OBJECTIVES

- Develop an Incident Command System (ICS) organizational structure for a mass evacuation and move.
- Develop incident safety message.
- Develop an Incident Briefing.
- Track patients using a Patient Tracking Form.
- Use benchmarks to order and assign appropriate resources.

SCENARIO ROLES AND TASKS

- In this scenario, you are the Bayport Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Chief, EMS 90.
- In this scenario, you will develop/complete:
 - ICS Organizational Charts.
 - ICS Form 202 (Incident Objectives).
 - Given incident objectives, complete the safety message.
 - ICS Form 201 (Incident Briefing).
 - Student Response Checklist.

 - Time: 1015 hours.

 - Wind: 8 mph southwest.

GROUP WORK

- Review the available resources and ensure that they will be sufficient to meet your evacuation goals.
- Assign resources to move patients.
- Develop ICS Organizational Charts.

- Develop the ICS Form 202 (Incident Objectives).
- Develop the ICS Form 201 (Incident Briefing).
