APPLICABILITY

2 All personnel.

POLICY

- 4 Social media provides a valuable tool to reach a large number of people quickly and efficiently.
- 5 As such, the Howard County Department of Fire and Rescue Services (Department) will use its
- 6 official Social Media presence to provide time-sensitive notification related to fire incidents,
- 7 special events, disasters, and other public emergencies.

- The Department will also use its official Social Media sites to aide in community outreach and
- 10 education efforts, and assist in the communication of fire safety advice, medical
- 11 recommendations, recognition, success stories, and statistics.

PROCEDURES

- 15 This General Order serves as an adjunct to the County's Social Media Policy, Howard County
- 16 Policy and Procedure 400.3: <u>Social Media Policy</u> (Revised 1/22/2015). The Department's social
- media presence will be administered by the Department's Public Information Office (PIO).
- 18 Personnel are encouraged to submit photos, videos, articles and other materials internally for
- 19 posting on the Department's public social media sites. These items can be directly submitted to
- 20 the PIO.

- 22 Department personnel have the right to use social media; however, all personnel are prohibited
- 23 from accessing personal social media sites while on duty if such access interferes with the
- 24 performance of assigned duties. It is important to remember that misconduct of any type,
- regardless of whether it occurs on social media, is governed by General Order 100.22: <u>Code of</u>
- 26 Conduct.

- 28 The use of personal recording devices such as cameras, video recorders, helmet cameras, audio
- 29 recorders, cell phones or any device with audio and video recorder applications are prohibited

30 31 32 33 34 35	while at any incident scene without prior approval of the Chief of the Department or designee. Personnel assigned to the PIO, Office of the Fire Marshal, Bureau of Education & Training, as well as Operational Field Battalion Chiefs, Medical Duty Officers, and Safety Officers may authorize the use of such devices for the official use of the Department. Members of the Department shall not post photo images, video, or audio of any incident scene or patient information on any social media site.
